## Mission

The mission of the Adult Literacy Center of Ozaukee County is to provide individualized educational services for adult learners to improve academic and life skills in order to pursue their personal, professional, and life goals.

## History

Founded in 1988, ALC began as a mission of Grace Lutheran Church in Grafton. To expand its service in the community, ALC became an independent nonprofit organization in 2013. Over the years, ALC has grown to include GED study, citizenship preparation and ESL. Grace continues its support by providing office space, tutor rooms and utilities to keep administrative costs at a minimum.

## **Why Literacy Matters**

Low literacy skills impact employability, income level, parenting and health. A parent with low literacy skills is more likely to have a child who has poor grades, behavioral issues and may eventually drop out (Wisconsin Literacy). According to the National Coalition on Literacy, improving basic adult education skills could save \$200 billion in government support programs. A better educated workforce means an increase in workplace efficiency, higher income, families who are more independent and children with a brighter future.

# BACK TO THE BEEACH

#### **RULES OVERVIEW**

- √ Teams have 20 seconds to consult on the spelling of the word.
- ✓ The speller has 30 seconds to come to the microphone and complete the spelling of the word without any aids or coaching.
- ✓ Once starting to spell the word, the speller may stop and restart from the beginning one time. Once the spelling of the word is done, that is the final spelling.
- ✓ REMEMBER Once you are at the mic, say the word, spell it, and say it again.
- ✓ Each team can **BUY BACK IN** only one time for \$100. A team will have 30 seconds to consult about buying back in at the time of elimination. Spectators may buy a team back in.
- ✓ No buying back-in during the Championship round. Rules for the Championship round will be reviewed at the start of the round.


#### Maureen Wiskerchen, Timekeeper
